




Fig.1 Grounded emitter output characteristics (I)




Fig.2 Grounded emitter output characteristics (II)




Fig.3 Grounded emitter propagation characteristics




Fig.4 DC current gain vs. collector current




Fig.5 Collector-emitter saturation voltage vs. collector current




Fig.6 Gain bandwidth product vs. collector current




Fig.7 Collector output capacitance vs. voltage




Fig.8 Back capacitance voltage




Fig.9 Output-on resistance vs. base current
