


### 4th Generation 1200 V, 2 A Silicon Carbide Schottky Diode

### **Description**

With the performance advantages of a Silicon Carbide (SiC) Schottky Barrier diode, power electronics systems can expect to meet higher efficiency standards than Si-based solutions, while also reaching higher frequencies and power densities. SiC diodes can be easily paralleled to meet various application demands, without concern of thermal runaway. In combination with the reduced cooling requirements and improved thermal performance of SiC products, SiC diodes are able to provide lower overall system costs in a variety of diverse applications.



SiC Schottky Diodes are majority carrier devices, so there is no reverse recovery charge.






**Figure 1**Forward Characteristics




**Figure 2**Reverse Characteristics




**Figure 3**Current Derating




**Figure 4** Power Derating




**Figure 5**Total Capacitance vs. Reverse Voltage




**Figure 6**Capacitace vs. Reverse Voltage



**Figure 7**Capacitance Stored Energy




**Figure 8**Non-Repetitive Peak Forward Surge Current versus Pulse Duration (sinusoidal waveform)



**Figure 9**Transient Thermal Impedance


