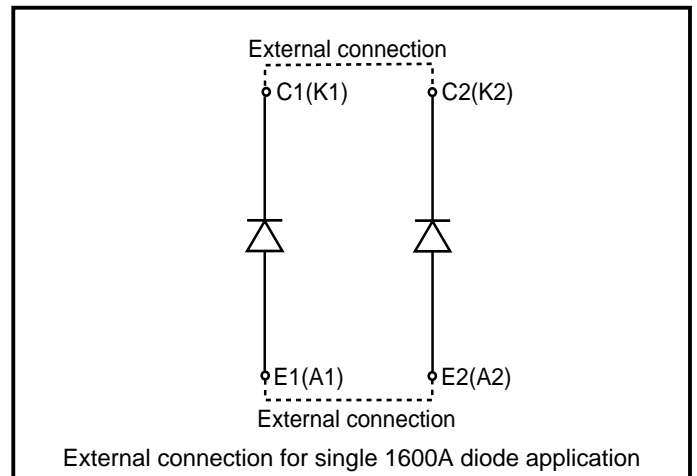


Fig. 1 Circuit diagram

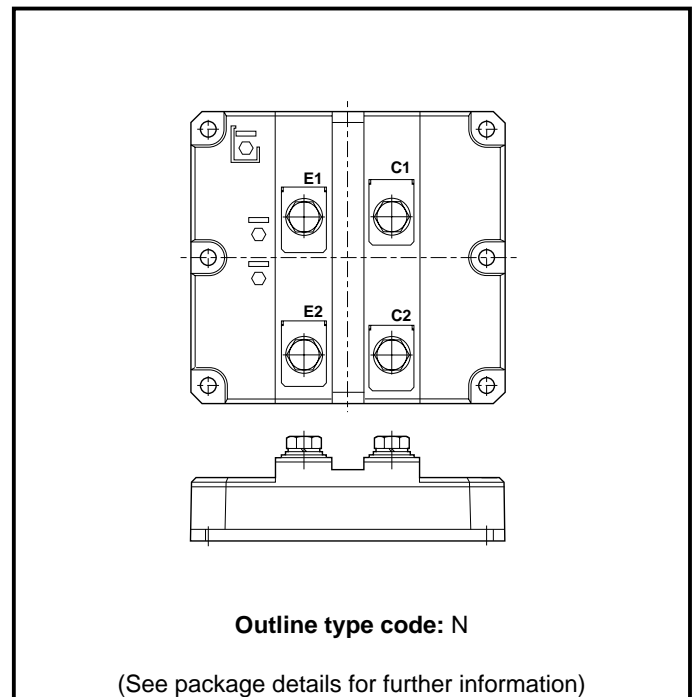


Fig. 2 Electrical connections - (not to scale)

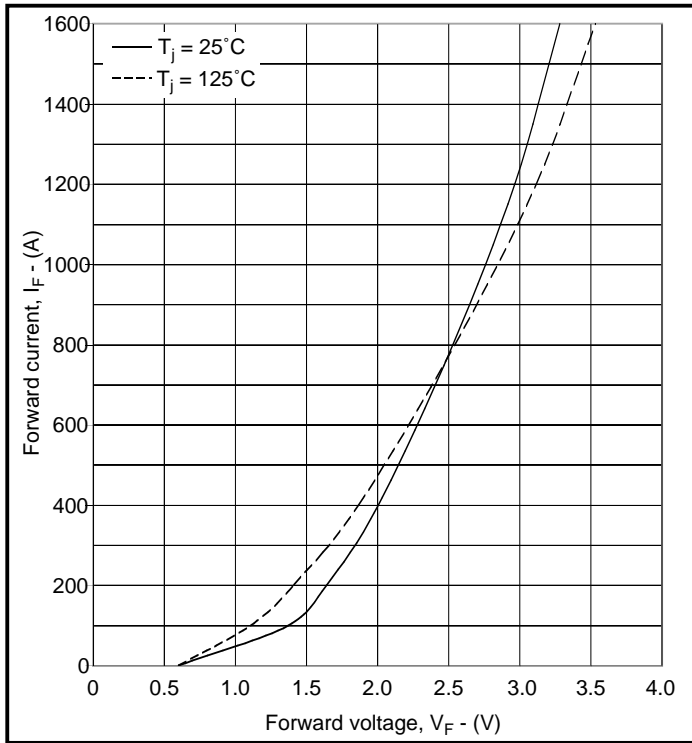


Fig. 2 Diode typical forward characteristics

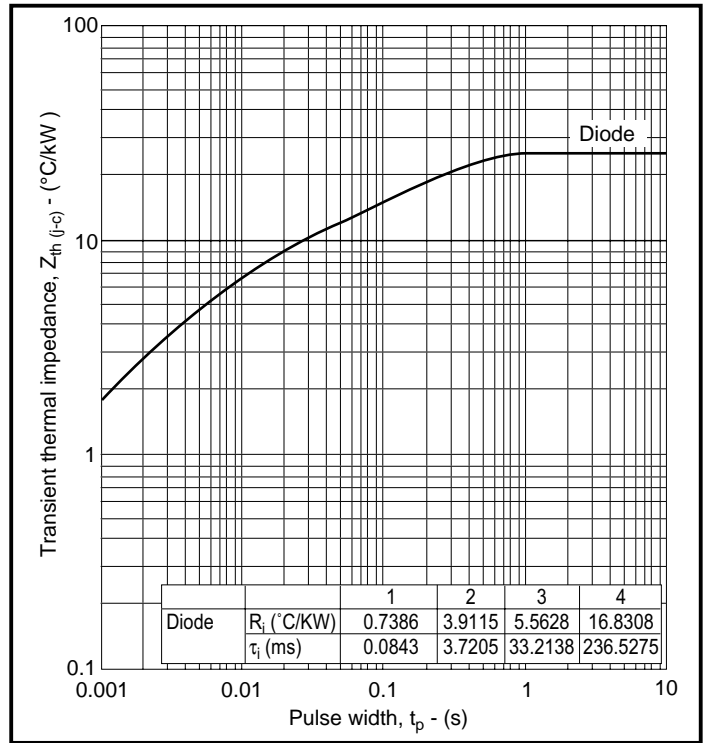


Fig. 4 Transient thermal impedance

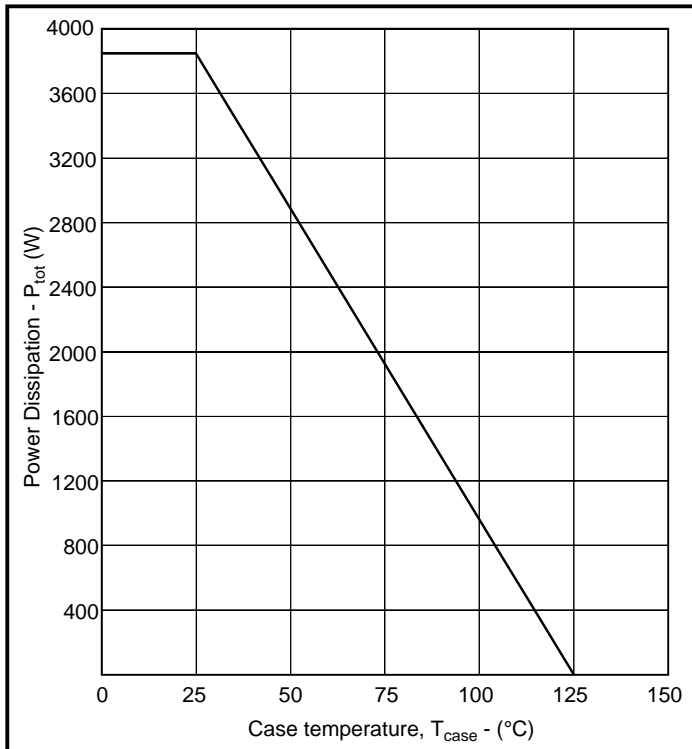


Fig. 5 Power dissipation

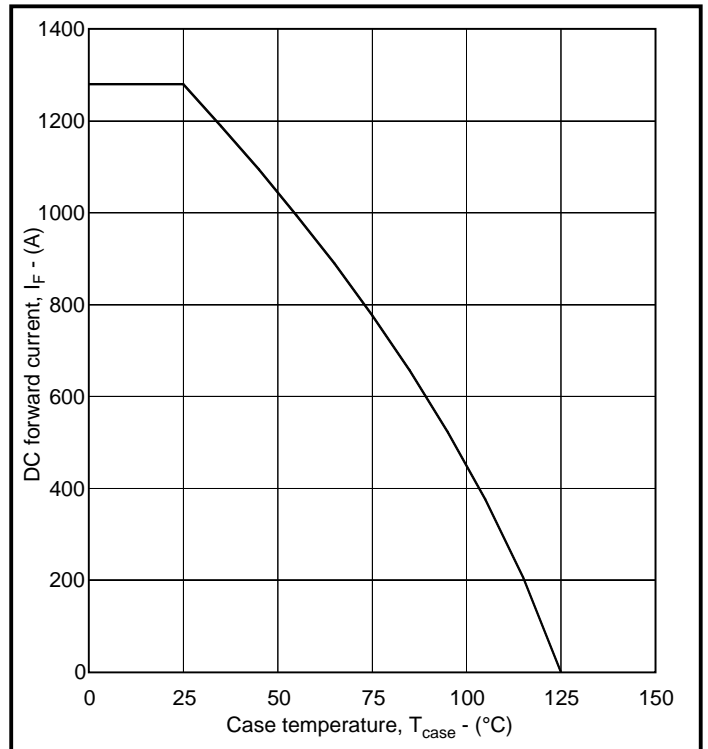


Fig. 6 DC current rating vs case temperature

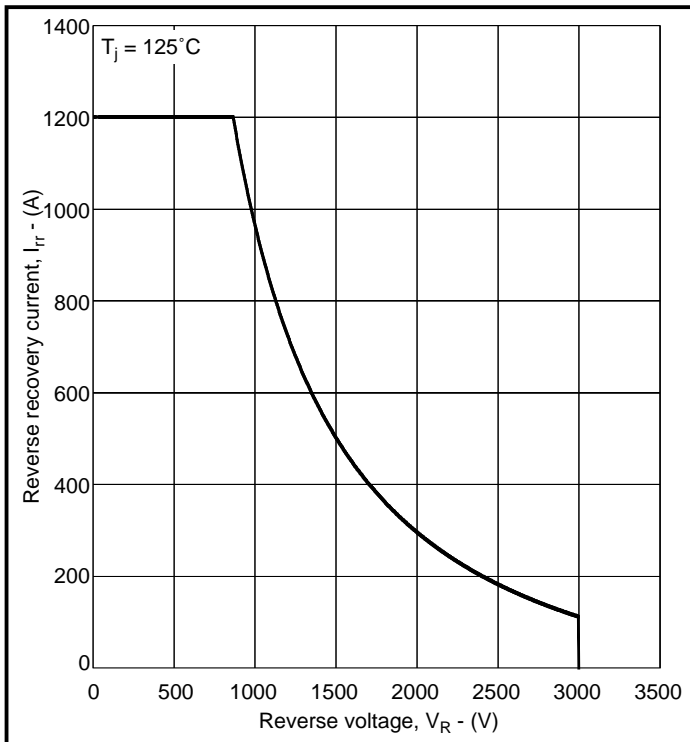
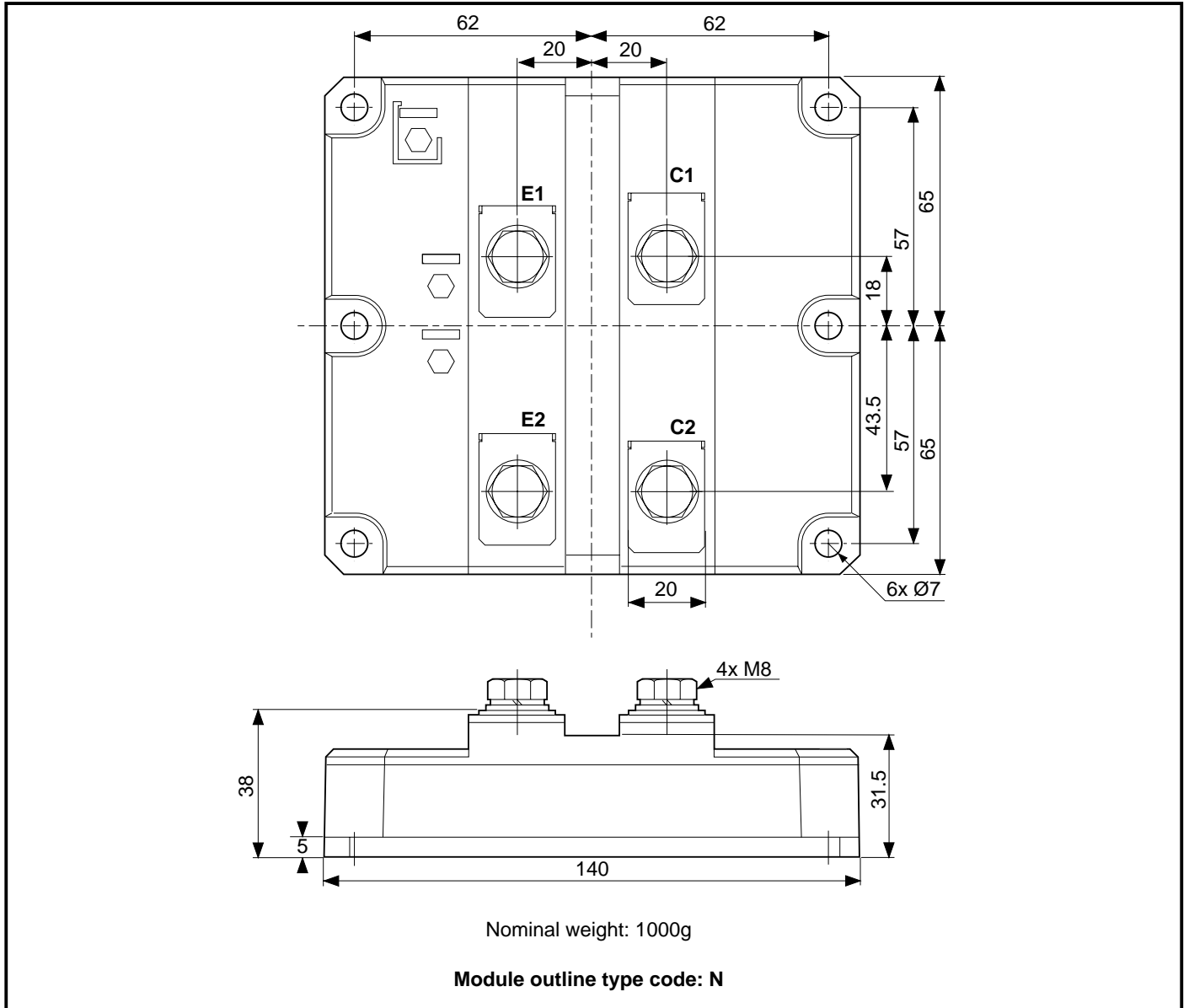


Fig. 7 RBSOA
