



Figure 1. Typical Output Characteristics




Figure 3. Typical Saturation Voltage Characteristics






Figure 5. Saturation Voltage vs. Case

**Figure 4. Transfer Characteristics** 




Figure 6. Saturation Voltage vs. V<sub>GE</sub>




Figure 7. Saturation Voltage vs. V<sub>GE</sub>




Figure 9. Capacitance Characteristics




Figure 11. SOA Characteristics




Figure 8. Saturation Voltage vs. V<sub>GE</sub>




Figure 10. Gate charge Characteristics




Figure 12. Turn-on Characteristics vs.
Gate Resistance




Figure 13. Turn-off Characteristics vs.
Gate Resistance




Figure 15. Turn-off Characteristics vs. Collector Current




Figure 17. Switching Loss vs. Collector Current




Figure 14. Turn-on Characteristics vs.
Collector Current




Figure 16. Switching Loss vs.

Gate Resistance




Figure 18. Turn off Switching SOA Characteristics




Figure 19. Current Derating




Figure 21. Load Current Vs. Frequency




Figure 23. Reverse Current




Figure 20. Power Dissipation




Figure 22. Forward Characteristics




Figure 24. Stored Charge




Figure 25. Reverse Recovery Time

Figure 26.Transient Thermal Impedance of IGBT





Figure 27.Transient Thermal Impedance of Diode
