The HS-7250/HS-7650 are an Intel® 852GME GMCH/ICH4 and HS-7250M/HS-7650M are an Intel® 852GM GMCH/ICH4 chipset-based board designed. The HS-7250/HS-7650 series is ideal all-in-one embedded engine board. Additional features include an enhanced I/O with CF, DVI-I/CRT/LVDS, dual LAN, audio, COM, and USB2.0 interfaces.


Its onboard ATA/33/66/100 to IDE drive interface architecture allows the HS-7250/HS-7650 series to support data transfers of 33, 66 or 100MB/sec. to one IDE drive connection. The HS-7250/HS-7650 supports Intel® Pentium® M/Celeron® M processor 1.3~2.0GHz, and HS-7250M/HS-7650M supports ULV Intel® Celeron® M processor 600MHz/512K.

The display controller is Intel® 852GME (HS-7250/HS-7650)/852GM (HS-7250M/HS-7650M) with 8MB shared main memory supporting CRT display or CHRONTEL 7301 for DVI-I display, supporting up to 1600 x 1200. It also provides 18-bit single channel/36-bit dual channel LVDS interface.

System memory is also sufficient with the one DDR socket that can support up to 1GB. It also provides one IDE interface Type I/II CF card adapter.

Additional onboard connectors include two internal and one external USB2.0 ports providing faster data transmission. And dual external RJ-45 connectors for 10/100 Based Ethernet use.



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# **Chapter 2**

# Unpacking

### 2.1 Opening the Delivery Package

The HS-7250/HS-7650 series is packed in an anti-static bag. The board has components that are easily damaged by static electricity. Do not remove the anti-static wrapping until proper precautions have been taken. Safety Instructions in front of this manual describe anti-static precautions and procedures.

#### 2.2 Inspection

After unpacking the board, place it on a raised surface and carefully inspect the board for any damage that might have occurred during shipment. Ground the board and exercise extreme care to prevent damage to the board from static electricity.

Integrated circuits will sometimes come out of their sockets during shipment. ExAwardne all integrated circuits, particularly the BIOS, processor, memory modules, ROM-Disk, and keyboard controller chip to ensure that they are firmly seated. 

## **Hardware Installation**


This chapter provides the information on how to install the hardware using the HS-7250/HS-7650 series. This chapter also contains information related to jumper settings of switch, and watchdog timer selection etc.

#### 3.1 Before Installation

After confirming your package contents, you are now ready to install your hardware. The following are important reminders and steps to take before you begin with your installation process.

- 1. Make sure that all jumper settings match their default settings and CMOS setup correctly. Refer to the sections on this chapter for the default settings of each jumper. (set JP2 1-2)
- 2. Go through the connections of all external devices and make sure that they are installed properly and configured correctly within the CMOS setup. Refer to the sections on this chapter for the detailed information on the connectors.
- 3. Keep the manual and diskette in good condition for future reference and use.
- **NOTE:** Since AD22 has been assigned for ISA bridge at HS-7250/ HS-7250M, please make sure do not use this address for other PCI cards to avoid confliction. In order to get detailed information, please contact technical support engineer.



HS-7250/HS-7650 provides 533MHz, if you want to use 533MHz FSB processor, please set *JP3/JP6*, and *JP3* is only for HS-7250/HS-7650.

#### **Heat Sink Installation**



Please smear the heat sink paste over CPU and 852GM uniformly. Then secure the heat sink as the picture above.

When lock the screw, please DO NOT too tight to locking, if too tight the PCB will be curved, it may cause the board damage.

The HS-7250/HS-7650 series provides one DDR socket at locations *DM1*. The maximum capacity of the onboard memory is 1GB.

#### 3.7 VGA Controller

The display controller is Intel® 82852GME (HS-7250/HS-7650)/ 82852GM (HS7250M/HS-7650M) for CRT display or CHRONTEL 7301 for DVI-I display, supporting up to 1600 x 1200. (DVI-I and CRT connector is optional)

HS-7250/HS-7650 series also provides 18-bit single channel/36-bit dual channel LVDS panel display interface. 



#### 3.17 Watchdog Timer

Once the Enable cycle is active a Refresh cycle is requested before the time-out period. This restarts counting of the WDT period. When the time counting goes over the period preset of WDT, it will assume that the program operation is abnormal. A system reset signal will restart when such error happens.



# **Chapter 4**

## **Award BIOS Setup**

The HS-7250/HS-7650 series uses Award BIOS for the system configuration. The Award BIOS setup program is designed to provide the maximum flexibility in configuring the system by offering various options that could be selected for end-user requirements. This chapter is written to assist you in the proper usage of these features.

### 4.1 Starting Setup

The Award BIOS is immediately activated when you first power on the computer. The BIOS reads the system information contained in the CMOS and begins the process of checking out the system and configuring it. When it finishes, the BIOS will seek an operating system on one of the disks and then launch and turn control over to the operating system.

While the BIOS is in control, the Setup program can be activated in one of two ways:

- 1. By pressing <Del> immediately after switching the system on, or
- By pressing the <Del> key when the following message appears briefly at the bottom of the screen during the POST (Power On Self Test).

#### Press DEL to enter SETUP.

If the message disappears before you respond and you still wish to enter Setup, restart the system to try again by turning it OFF then ON or pressing the "RESET" button on the system case. You may also restart by simultaneously pressing <Ctrl>, <Alt>, and <Delete> keys. If you do not press the keys at the correct time and the system does not boot, an error message will be displayed and you will be asked to...

#### PRESS F1 TO CONTINUE, DEL TO ENTER SETUP

### 4.2 Using Setup

In general, you use the arrow keys to highlight items, press <Enter> to select, use the <PageUp> and <PageDown> keys to change entries, and press <Esc> to quit. The following table provides more detail about how to navigate in the Setup program using the keyboard.



PIO means Programmed Input/Output. Rather than having the BIOS issue a series of commands to affect the transfer to or from the disk drive, PIO allows the BIOS to tell the controller what it wants and then let the controller and the CPU perform the complete task by themselves. This chapter illustrates the detailed information of Chipset, VGA, LAN, and audio driver installation procedures. The utility disk that comes with the delivery package contains an auto-run program that invokes the installation programs for the Chipset, VGA, LAN and Audio drivers. The following sections describe the installation procedures of each driver based on Windows XP/2K operating systems. Other operation systems may slightly different.

## 5.1 Chipset Driver Installation

1. Insert Utility CD Disk into your CD-ROM drive. The main menu will pop up as shown below. Select on the **Chipset** button to launch the installation program.




