3 DESCRIPTIONS

The RS8651 series of CMOS operational amplifiers use auto-zero techniques to simultaneously provide very low offset voltage (20µV max) and near-zero drift over time and temperature. This family of amplifiers has ultra-low noise, offset and power.

This miniature, high-precision operational amplifiers offset high input impedance and rail-to-rail output swing. With high gain-bandwidth product of 2.0MHz and slew rate of 1.0V/µs. Either single or dual supplies can be used in the range from 3.3V to 32V (±1.65V to ±16V).

The RS8651 families of operational amplifiers are specified at the full temperature range of −40°C to +85°C.






Figure 1. Offset Voltage vs Temperature




Figure 2. Offset Voltage vs Temperature




Figure 3. Supply Voltage vs Quiescent Current




Figure 4. Quiescent Current vs Temperature




Figure 5. Quiescent Current vs Temperature




Figure 6. Input Bias Current vs Temperature

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

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

Temperature







Figure 9. Source Current vs Temperature

Figure 10. Open-Loop Gain vs Temperature








Figure 11. Power-Supply Rejection Ratio vs

Temperature







