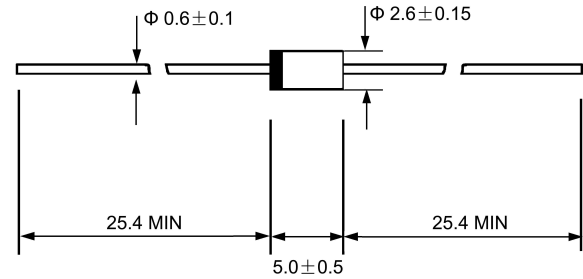

FIG.1 – FORWARD CURRENT DERATING CURVE

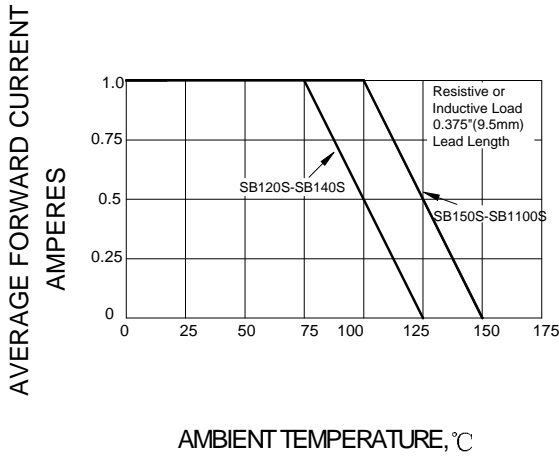


FIG.2 – MAXIMUM NON-REPETITIVE PEAK FORWARD SURGE CURRENT

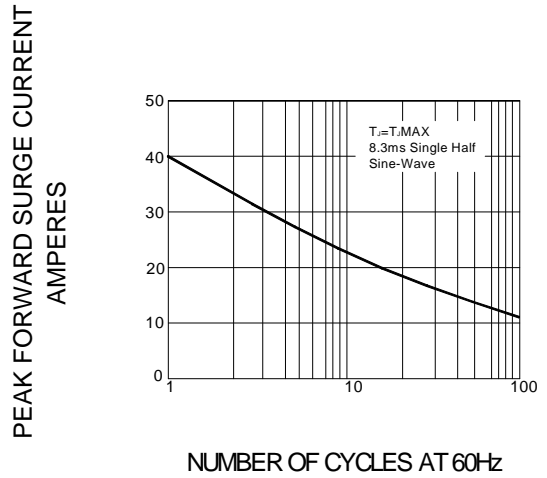


FIG.3 – TYPICAL INSTANTANEOUS FORWARD CHARACTERISTICS

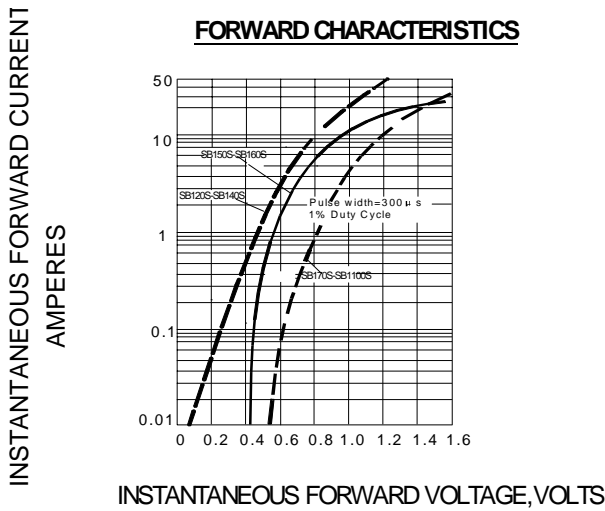


FIG.4 – TYPICAL REVERSE CHARACTERISTICS

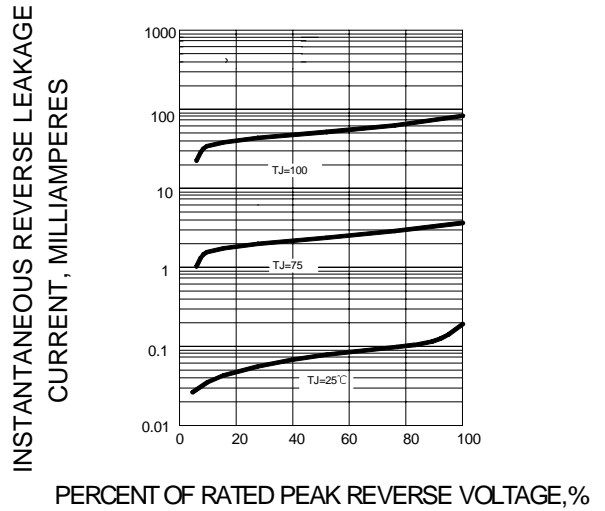


FIG.5 – TYPICAL JUNCTION CAPACITANCE

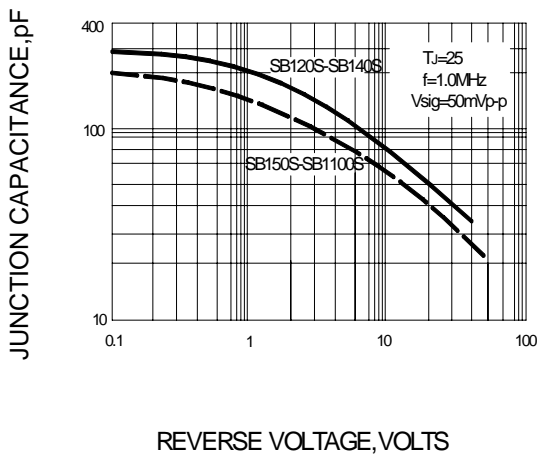


FIG.6 – TYPICAL TRANSIENT THERMAL IMPEDANCE
