Listening caution

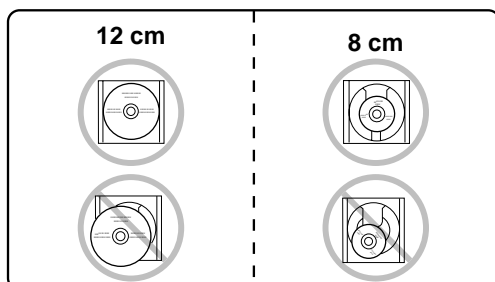

Playing DVDs and Video CDs

The producer of these discs can control how they are played so you may not always be able to control play as described in these operating instructions (for example if the play time is not displayed or if a Video CD has menus). Read the disc's instructions carefully.

■ Inserting a disc correctly



- Insert the disc correctly into position as indicated in the diagrams above.
- Place only one disc on a tray.
- Insert the disc with the label side facing up.

■ Playing PAL system DVD-Audio

This unit converts PAL to NTSC for play. The picture is compressed to show it in its entirety, but this may cause it to be stretched vertically.

■ To clean discs

Wipe with a damp cloth and then wipe dry.

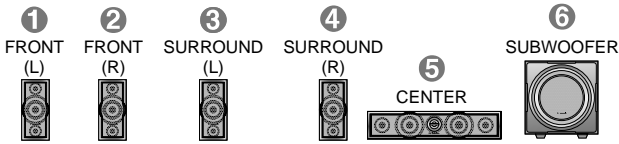
- Clean with an optional DVD-RAM/PD disc cleaner (LF-K200DCA1, where available).
- Never use cloths or cleaners for CDs, etc.

■ Handling precautions

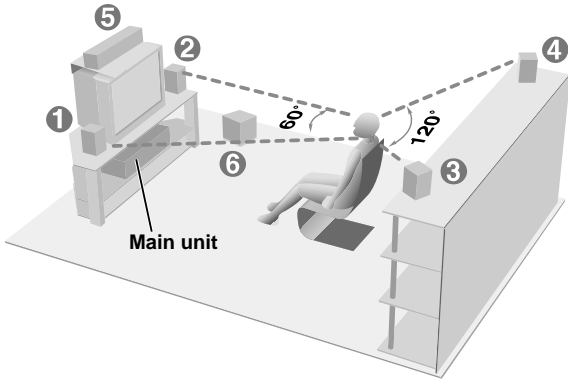
- Do not write on the label side with a ball-point pen or other writing instrument.
- Do not use record cleaning sprays, benzene, thinner, static electricity prevention liquids or any other solvent.
- Do not attach labels or stickers to discs. (Do not use discs with exposed adhesive from tape or left over peeled-off stickers.)
- Do not use scratch-proof protectors or covers.
- Do not use discs printed with label printers available on the market.
- Do not use irregularly shaped discs (e.g. heart-shaped), as these can damage the unit.
- Do not use discs that are badly warped or cracked.

Simple setup

STEP 1 Positioning



Setup example



- The front and surround speakers are the same. Use those you have connected the short cords to as front speakers and those you have connected the long cords to as surround speakers.
- Place the front, center, and surround speakers at approximately the same distance from the seating position. The angles in the diagram are approximate.

Use only supplied speakers

Using other speakers can damage the unit and sound quality will be negatively affected.

- Set the speakers up on an even surface to prevent them from falling. Take proper precautions to prevent the speakers from falling if you cannot set them up on an even surface.

Positioning for best effect

How you set up your speakers can affect the bass and the sound field. Note the following points.

- Place speakers on flat secure bases.
- Placing speakers too close to floors, walls, and corners can result in excessive bass. Cover walls and windows with thick curtain.

Main unit

Note

Keep your speakers at least 10 mm ($\frac{13}{32}$ ") away from the system for proper ventilation.

Center speaker

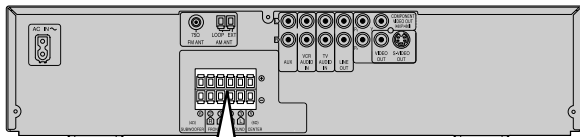
- You can also put this speaker directly under the television.
- Vibration caused by the center speaker can disrupt the picture if it is placed directly on the television. Put the center speaker on a rack or shelf.

Subwoofer

Place to the right or left of the television, on the floor or a sturdy shelf so that it won't cause vibration.

Leave 10 cm (4") at the rear for ventilation.

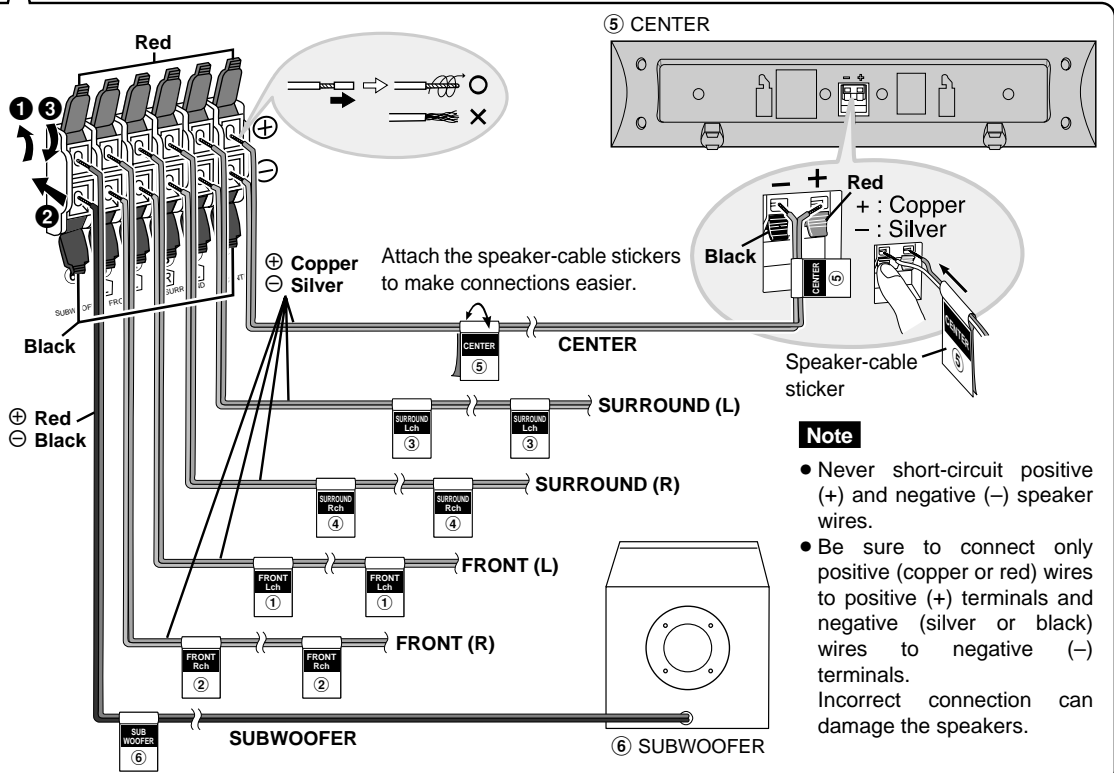
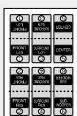

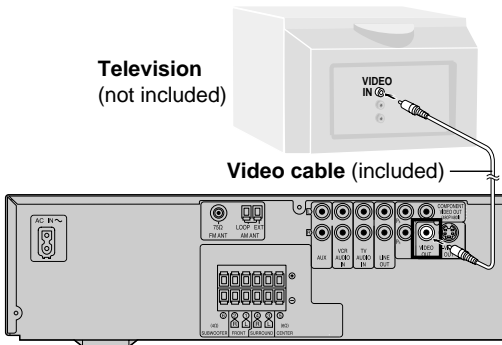


Sheet of speaker-cable stickers



STEP 3 Television

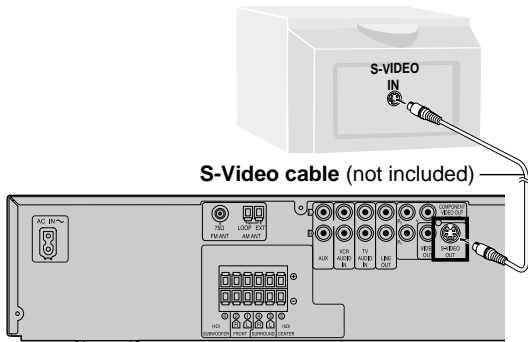
■ Connecting a television with a VIDEO IN terminal



Connect directly to your television.

Do not connect the unit through a video cassette recorder, because the picture may not be played correctly due to the copy guard.

■ Connecting a television with an S-VIDEO IN terminal



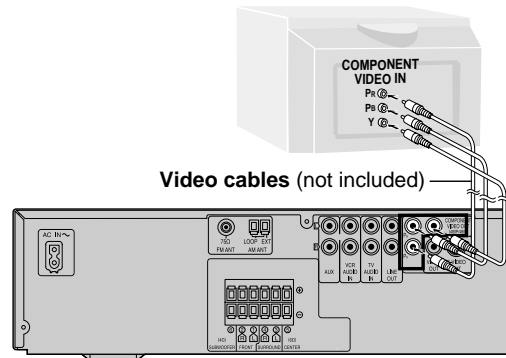
S-VIDEO OUT terminal

The S-VIDEO OUT terminal achieves a more vivid picture than the VIDEO OUT terminal by separating the chrominance (C) and luminance (Y) signals. (Actual results depend on the television.)

■ Connecting a television with COMPONENT VIDEO IN terminals



COMPONENT VIDEO OUT terminals

These terminals can be used for either interlace or progressive output and provide a purer picture than the S-VIDEO OUT terminal. Connection using these terminals outputs the color difference signals (P_B/P_R) and luminance signal (Y) separately in order to achieve high fidelity in reproducing colors.

- The description of the component video input terminals depends on the television or monitor (e.g. Y/P_B/P_R, Y/B-Y/R-Y, Y/C_B/C_R). Connect to terminals of the same color.
- After making this connection, change the black level for a better picture (→ page 28, Video – Black Level Control).

To enjoy progressive video

- Connect to the component video (480P) input terminals on a television compatible with this unit's copy guard system. (Video will not be displayed correctly if connected to an incompatible television.)
- Press [PROGRESSIVE] on the main unit so "PROG." appears on the display (→ page 12).
- All televisions manufactured by Panasonic and that have 480P input connectors are compatible. Consult the manufacturer if you have another brand of television.

STEP 4 Antennas and AC power supply cord

- Connect the AC power supply cord after all other connections are complete.
- Optional antenna connections (→ page 30).

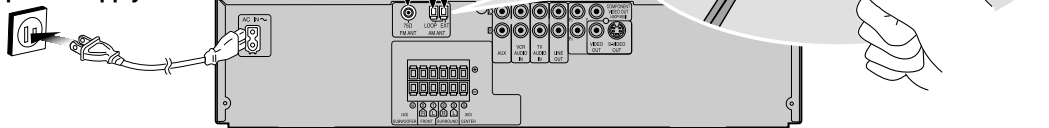

Conserving power

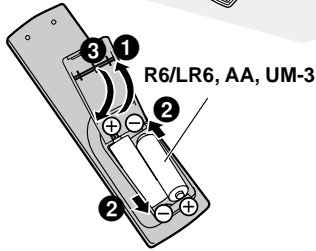
The unit consumes power (approx. 0.5 W) even when it is turned off with [⏻]. To save power when the unit will not be used for a long time, unplug it from the household AC outlet.

You will need to reset some memory items after plugging in the unit.

STEP 5 The remote control

Remote control

Batteries



- Insert so the poles (+ and -) match those in the remote control.
- Do not use rechargeable type batteries.

Do not;

- mix old and new batteries.
 - use different types at the same time.
 - heat or expose to flame.
 - take apart or short circuit.
 - attempt to recharge alkaline or manganese batteries.
 - use batteries if the covering has been peeled off.
- Mishandling of batteries can cause electrolyte leakage which can damage items the fluid contacts and may cause a fire.

Remove if the remote control is not going to be used for a long period of time. Store in a cool, dark place.

■ Use

Aim at the sensor, avoiding obstacles, at a maximum range of 7 m (23 feet) directly in front of the unit.

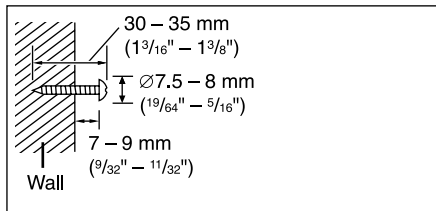
Other speaker setup options

Attaching to a wall

Note

The wall or pillar on which the speakers are to be attached should be capable of supporting 5 kg (11 lb.) per screw.

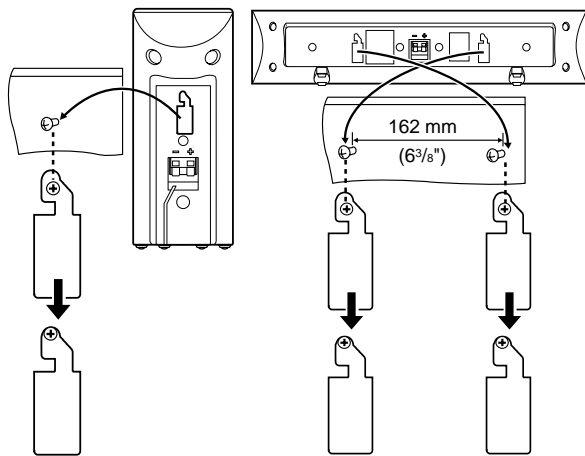
1 Screw a screw (not included) into the wall.



2 Fit the speaker securely onto the screw with the hole or holes.

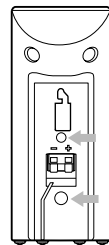


Fitting speaker stands (optional)

Preparation

Ensure the stands meet these conditions before purchasing them.

- Observe the diameter and length of the screws and the distance between screws as shown in the diagram.
- The stands must be able to support over 5 kg (11 lb.).
- The stands must be stable even if the speakers are in a high position.



Attach the stands with these holes.

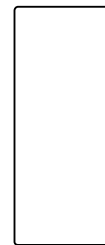


Plate thickness plus 7 to 10 mm (plus 9/32" to 13/32")

Notes on speaker use

- You can damage your speakers and shorten their useful life if you play sound at high levels over extended periods.
- Reduce the volume in the following cases to avoid damage.
 - When playing distorted sound.
 - When the speakers are receiving howling from a record player, noise from FM broadcasts, or continuous signals from an oscillator, test disc, or electronic instrument.
 - When adjusting the sound quality.
 - When turning the unit on or off.

If irregular coloring occurs on your television

These speakers are designed to be used close to a television, but the picture may be affected with some televisions and setup combinations.

If this occurs, turn the television off for about 30 minutes.

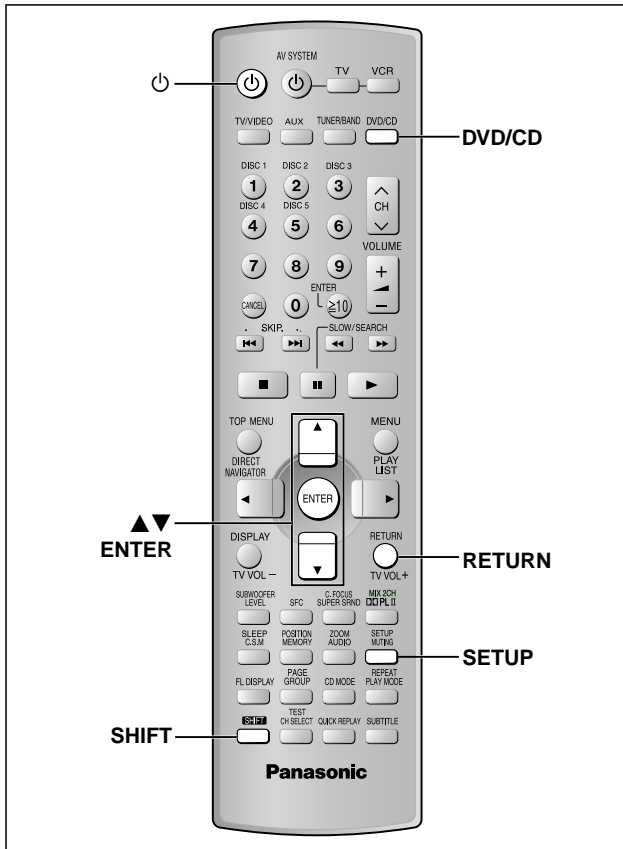
The television's demagnetizing function should correct the problem. If it persists, move the speakers further away from the television.



Caution

- Use the speakers only with the recommended system. Failure to do so may lead to damage to the amplifier and/or the speakers, and may result in the risk of fire. Consult a qualified service person if damage has occurred or if you experience a sudden change in performance.
- Do not attempt to attach these speakers to walls using methods other than those described in this manual.

STEP 6 QUICK SETUP

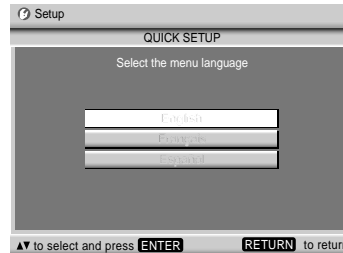


The **QUICK SETUP** screen appears when you press [SHIFT]+[SETUP] the first time after purchase and assists you to make necessary settings. You can access this screen again later if you need to (⇒ page 28, Others — QUICK SETUP).

Preparation

Turn on the television and select the appropriate video input on the television to suit the connections for the unit.

- 1 Press [POWER] to turn on the unit.
- 2 Press [DVD/CD] to select “DVD/CD” as the source.
- 3 Press [SHIFT]+[SETUP] to show the QUICK SETUP screen.



- 4 Press [▲, ▼] to select the menu language and press [ENTER].
- 5 Press [▲, ▼] to select “Yes” to continue and press [ENTER].
- 6 Press [▲, ▼] to select the item and press [ENTER].
 - TV Type (⇒ below)
 - TV Aspect (⇒ below)
- 7 Press [ENTER] and then [SHIFT]+[SETUP] to exit the settings.

To return to the previous screen

Press [RETURN].

■ TV Type

Select to suit the type of television.

- Standard (Direct View TV) (factory preset)
- CRT Projector
- LCD TV/Projector
- Projection TV
- Plasma TV

■ TV Aspect

Select “4:3” (regular) or “16:9” (widescreen) to suit your television. If you have a regular 4:3 television, you can also select how video on some discs is shown (⇒ page 28, Video – TV Aspect).

- 4:3 Pan&Scan (factory preset)

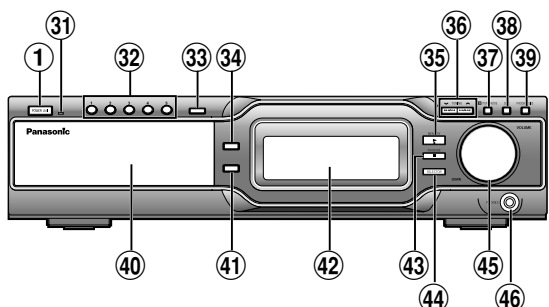
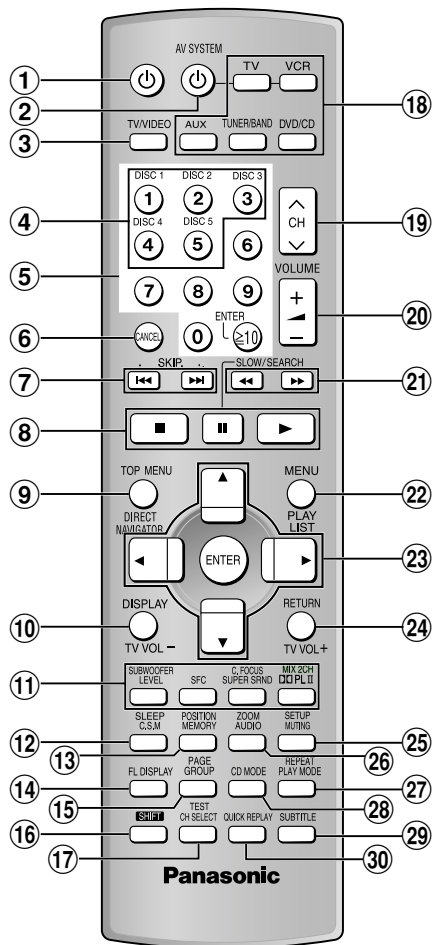
Widescreen software expands the picture to fill the screen of a 4:3 aspect television (unless prohibited by the producer of the disc).



- 4:3 Letterbox

Widescreen software shows the picture in letterbox style on a 4:3 aspect television.





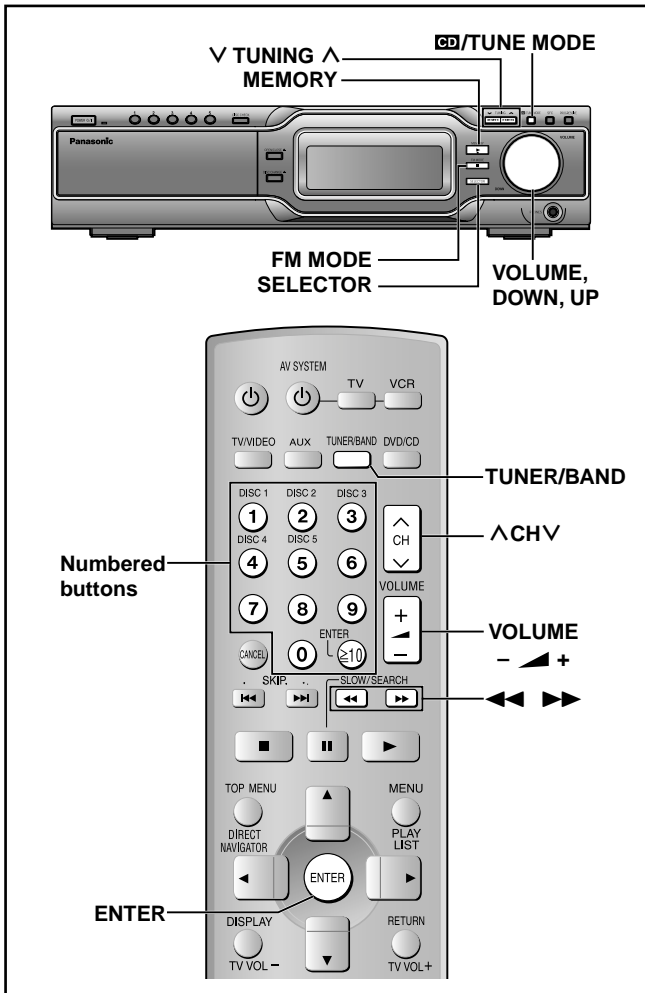

FM frequency settings

You can change the FM step. The step is factory-set to 0.2 MHz, but you can change it to receive broadcasts allocated 0.1 MHz steps.

1 Press [TUNER/BAND] to select "FM".

2 Press and hold [SELECTOR] on the main unit.

After a few seconds the display changes to show the current minimum frequency. Continue to hold the button down. The minimum frequency changes and the step is changed.

To return to the original step, repeat the above steps.

Note

Any FM/AM frequencies preset in channels will be changed by this procedure. Preset them again.

Preset tuning

There are two methods of pre-setting stations.

Automatic presetting: All the stations the tuner can receive are preset.

Manual presetting: You can select the stations to preset and the order they are preset in.

Up to 15 stations can be set in each, the FM and AM bands.

Automatic presetting

Do the following once

For each, FM and AM.

Tune to the frequency where pre-setting is to begin.

Press and hold [ENTER] until the frequency changes.

• Main unit: Press and hold [MEMORY].

The tuner presets all the stations it can receive into the channels in ascending order.

"SET OK" is displayed when the stations are set. The last station to be set is then played.

"ERROR" is displayed

Presetting was unsuccessful. Preset manually.

Manual presetting

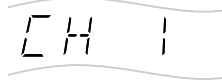
1 Tune to the station (→ see left: "Manual tuning").

2 Press [ENTER].

3 While "PGM" is flashing

Press the numbered buttons to select a channel.

- Label-up (With double-sided discs, load so the label for the side you want to play is facing up.)

The disc indicator lights orange to show the tray is in the play position.

Play begins.

WMA MP3 JPEG CD (CD text only)

- Press [SUBTITLE] to turn the display on or off.
- You can also use the navigation menus to control play (→ page 18).

5 Adjust the volume.

■ To pause play

Press [⏸] during play.

Press [▶] (play) to restart play.

■ To stop play

Press [■] (→ page 13, Resume function).

■ To select a disc

Press [SHIFT] + disc button ([DISC 1]–[DISC 5]).

■ To prevent damage

Do not;

- load more than one disc per tray.
- close the drawer by hand.

Note

- If “⊘” appears on the television

The operation is prohibited by the unit or disc.

- It may take some time for play to start but this is normal.

When a menu appears on the television

DVD-A DVD-V VCD

Press the numbered buttons to select an item.

To select a 2-digit number

Example: To select item 23, press [≧10] → [2] → [3].

- When playing DVDs, you can also use [▲, ▼, ◀, ▶] to select items. Press [ENTER] to confirm your selection.

To return to the menu screen

DVD-A DVD-V [TOP MENU]: Shows the first menu screen.

DVD-V [MENU]: Shows the menu screen.

VCD [RETURN]: Shows the menu screen.

Note

The disc continues to rotate while the menu is displayed even after you finish playing an item. Press [■] when you finish to preserve the unit’s motor and your television screen.

Sequential play (CD Mode)

VCD CD WMA MP3

The unit usually plays the disc in the play position and then stops.

Turn CD Mode on to play all loaded discs, except for DVDs and JPEG discs.

While stopped

Press [CD] /TUNE MODE].

- Remote control: Press [CD MODE].

You can change the other discs without interrupting play.

Main unit only

2 Within about 10 seconds

Press [DISC 1] – [DISC 5] to open the tray and change the disc.

Press [DISC CHANGE ▲] again to close the tray.

Repeat steps 1 and 2 to change other discs. You can load up to 5 discs.

Checking the disc trays

You can check whether a 12 cm disc is in a tray without interrupting play.

Main unit only

Press [DISC CHECK].

If the player is stopped, all trays will open.

If a disc is being played, the corresponding tray will not open.

Press [DISC CHECK] again to close the trays.

- Do not remove or insert discs during a disc check.
- Do not pull out the trays during a disc check.

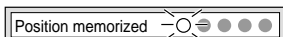
Position Memory function

RAM DVD-A DVD-V VCD CD WMA MP3 (Only when the elapsed play time can be displayed.)

JPEG: Works with all JPEG content.

During play

Press [POSITION MEMORY] to memorize a position.



Press again to replace the position.

This position is saved even if you turn the unit off, change the source or change discs. When you turn the unit on, reselect "DVD/CD" or reinsert the disc whose position you memorized, "RESUME" lights on the display. Press [▶] (play) to start play from the memorized position. The position is cleared.

- After changing the source or selecting another disc, re-selecting the disc tray with the memorized position automatically starts playback.
- You can memorize positions on up to five different discs at a time. When you memorize another position, the earliest position is replaced.
- You cannot recall the position in CD Mode.

Resume function

"RESUME" lights on the display when the unit has recorded the position at which you stopped play.

Press [▶] (play) to start play from that position.

- The position is cleared when you:
 - Turn the unit off.
 - Select another source or change discs.
- Press [■] to clear the position.

Chapter Preview

DVD-V

The following message appears immediately after you press [▶] (play) when "RESUME" is displayed.

Press [▶] (play) while the message is displayed and the beginning portions of each chapter up to the current one are played.

Full play resumes from the point where you pressed [■] or [POSITION MEMORY].

(This feature works only within a title.)

If you do not press [▶] (play), the message disappears and play starts from where you pressed [■] or [POSITION MEMORY].

Skip back a few seconds.

This feature may not work while playing some parts of a disc or at all with some discs.

Glossary

Decoder

A decoder restores the coded audio signals on DVDs to normal. This is called decoding.

Dolby Digital

This is a method of coding digital signals developed by Dolby Laboratories. Apart from stereo (2-channel) audio, these signals can also be multi-channel audio. A large amount of audio information can be recorded on one disc using this method.

DTS (Digital Theater Systems)

This surround system is used in many movie theaters around the world. There is good separation between the channels, so realistic sound effects are possible.

Dynamic range

Dynamic range is the difference between the lowest level of sound that can be heard above the noise of the equipment and the highest level of sound before distortion occurs.

Film and video

DVD-Videos are recorded using either film or video. Usually, film is recorded at 24 frames per second, the rate movies are filmed at, while video is recorded at 30 frames per second.

Frame still and field still

Frames are the still pictures that go together to make a moving picture. There are about 30 frames shown each second. One frame is made up of two fields. A regular television shows these fields one after the other to create frames. A still is shown when you pause a moving picture. A frame still is made up of two alternating fields, so the picture may appear blurred, but overall quality is high. A field still is not blurred, but it has only half the information of a frame still so picture quality is lower.

Interlace and progressive output

NTSC, the video signal standard, has 480 interlaced (I) scan lines, whereas progressive scanning uses twice the number of scan lines. This is called 480P. The video signals output from this unit's COMPONENT VIDEO OUT terminals (Y, P_B, P_R) allow you to enjoy higher quality pictures than if the signals were output from the VIDEO OUT terminal or S-VIDEO OUT terminal.

I/P/B

MPEG 2, the video compression standard adopted for use with DVD-Video, codes frames using these 3 picture types.

I: Intra coded picture

This picture has the best quality and is the best to use when adjusting the picture.

P: Predictive coded picture

This picture is calculated based on past I or P-pictures.

B: Bidirectionally-predictive coded picture

This picture is calculated by comparing past and future I and P-pictures so it has the lowest volume of information.

Linear PCM (pulse code modulation)

These are uncompressed digital signals, similar to those found on CDs.

Playback control (PBC)

If a Video CD has playback control, you can select scenes and information with menus.

WMA, MP3, JPEG and CD text information

- Discs must conform to ISO9660 level 1 or 2 (except for extended formats).
- This unit is compatible with multi-session but if there are a lot of sessions it takes more time for play to start. Keep the number of sessions to a minimum to avoid this.

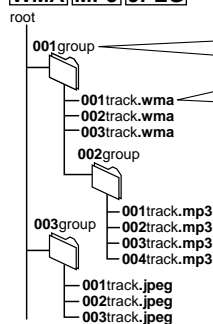
