


Description

This high-voltage device is a Zener-protected N-channel Power MOSFET developed using the SuperMESH technology by STMicroelectronics, an optimization of the well-established PowerMESH. In addition to a significant reduction in on-resistance, this device is designed to ensure a high level of dv/dt capability for the most demanding applications.

Figure 1. Safe operating area




Figure 2. Thermal impedance




Figure 3. Output characteristics




Figure 4. Transfer characteristics




Figure 5. Static drain-source on resistance




Figure 6. Gate charge vs gate-source voltage




Figure 7. Capacitance variations




Figure 8. Normalized gate threshold voltage vs temperature




Figure 9. Normalized on resistance vs temperature




Figure 10. Normalized $V_{(BR)DSS}$ vs temperature




Figure 11. Source-drain diode forward characteristics



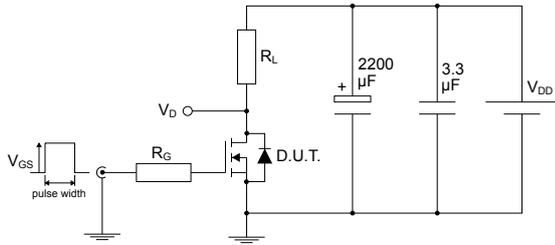



Figure 12. Avalanche energy vs temperature



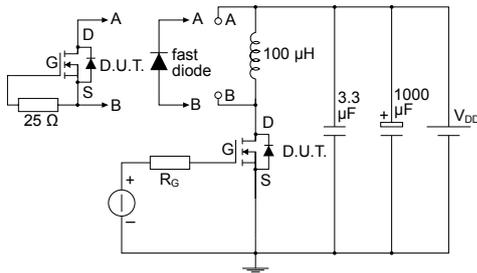

Figure 13. Test circuit for resistive load switching times


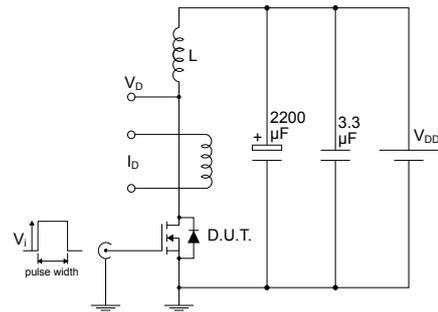
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Figure 14. Test circuit for gate charge behavior


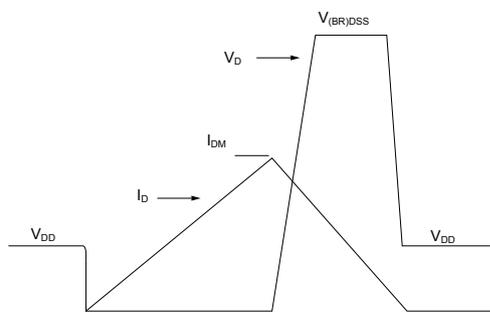
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Figure 15. Test circuit for inductive load switching and diode recovery times


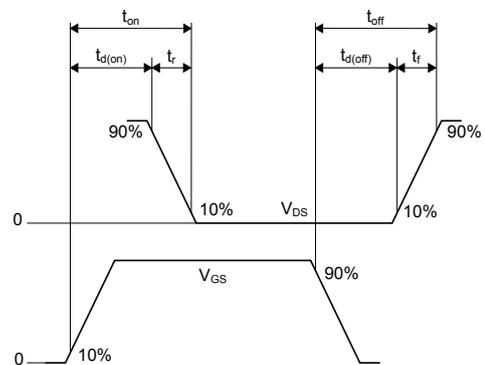
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Figure 16. Unclamped inductive load test circuit

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Figure 18. Switching time waveform



