




Fig.1 Typical Output Characteristics




Fig.3 Forward Characteristics of Reverse




Fig.5 Normalized V<sub>GS(th)</sub> vs. T<sub>J</sub>




Fig.2 On-Resistance vs. G-S Voltage




Fig.4 Gate-Charge Characteristics





Fig.6 Normalized R<sub>DSON</sub> vs. T<sub>J</sub>










Fig.7 Capacitance

Fig.8 Safe Operating Area




Fig.9 Normalized Maximum Transient Thermal Impedance




Fig.10 Switching Time Waveform




Fig.11 Unclamped Inductive Switching Waveform



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
