
### ■ Description








Fig.7 Gate Charge Characteristics




Fig.8 Capacitance Characteristics




Fig.9 V\_GS(th) Variation with Temperature (Normalized)




Fig.10 Maximum Drain Current vs. Case Temperature




Fig.11 Single Pulse Maximum Power Dissipation




Fig.12 Output Capacitance Stored Energy




Fig.13 Transient Thermal Response Curve





Fig.14 Maximum Safe Operating Area




Fig15-1. Gate charge measurement circuit




Fig15-2. Gate charge waveform




Fig16-1. Diode reverse recovery test circuit




Fig16-1. Diode reverse recovery test waveform




Fig17-1. Switching time test circuit for resistive load




Fig17-2. Switching time waveform




Fig18-1. Unclamped inductive load test circuit





Fig18-2. Unclamped inductive waveform
