




$t_{rr}$  WAVEFORMS AND DEFINITIONS

- $Q_1 = \text{IGBT } (BV_{CES} > \text{DUT } V_{R(AVL)})$

Figure 1. Typical Forward Voltage Drop




Figure 2. Typical Reverse Current




Figure 3. Typical Junction Capacitance




Figure 4. Typical Reverse Recovery Time




Figure 5. Typical Reverse Recovery Current





Figure 6. Forward Current Deration Curve
