


Fig 1. Typical Output Characteristics




Fig 2. Typical Output Characteristics




Fig 3. On-Resistance v.s. Gate Voltage




Fig 4. Normalized On-Resistance v.s. Junction Temperature




Fig 5. Forward Characteristics of Reverse Diode







Fig 6. Gate Threshold Voltage v.s. Junction Temperature




**Fig 7. Gate Charge Characteristics**




**Fig 8. Typical Capacitance Characteristics**




**Fig 9. Maximum Safe Operating Area**
