IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

Placement

The unit should be placed on a flat surface, away from direct sunshine, high temperature, humidity and frequent vibration. Otherwise, the case and other internal parts will be damaged and the service life of the unit will be shortened.

In order to avoid distortion or abnormal sound effects, there should be at least a distance of 15cm between the unit and the wall. Do not place heavy objects on the top of the unit.

Voltage

Overvoltage must be avoided; overvoltage will lead to overload of the unit and fire.

Do not use a DC power supply. Check if the power supply meets the requirement when the unit is set up in ships or other locations where DC power supply is used.

Protection of power supply cord

The AC power supply cord should be properly connected, ensuring that there is no damage in the cord. Poor connection or damage in cord may lead to fire or electrical shock. It is prohibited to pull or bend the cord or place heavy objects upon the cord.

When unplugging the AC power supply cord, just grasp the plug firmly. Electric shock may occur if you unplug the cord by pulling the cord.

Do not plug in or unplug the plug with wet hand, for fear of electric shock.

Foreign matter

Do not drop metal objects into the unit for fear of leakage current or fault.

Do not drop liquid into the unit for fear of leakage current or fault. In case any liquid drops into the unit, immediately unplug the AC cord, and contact your dealer.

Do not spray insecticide onto or into the unit. The insecticide sprays contain inflammable gas; if it enters the inside of the unit, fire may be caused.

Service

Do not try to repair the unit by yourself. If there is a fault e.g. interrupted sound, indicator blankoff, smoke emission or other faults unlisted in the operating instructions, unplug the AC power supply cord, and contact your dealer or the authorized service center.

Electric shock or damage to the unit may occur if the unit is repaired, dismantled, or reassembled by unqualified personnel.

Before cleaning the unit, please unplug the AC power supply cord.

When the unit is not to be used for a long period, please unplug the AC power supply cord so as to prolong the service life of the unit.

Use discs with the above logos and that conform to specifications. The unit cannot play other discs correctly. Do not use irregularly shaped discs (e.g. heart-shaped), as these can damage the unit. It may not be possible to play CD-R, CD-RW, DVD-R and DVD-RAM in all cases due to the type of disc or condition of the recording.

■ Discs that cannot be played

DVD-ROM, CD-ROM, CDV, CD-G, +RW, DVD-RW, CVD, SACD, Divx Video Disc and Photo CD, DVD-RAM that cannot be removed from their cartridge, 2.6-GB and 5.2-GB DVD-RAM, and "Chaoji VCD" available on the market including CVD, DVCD and SVCD that do not conform to IEC62107.

■ Built-in decoders

This unit can play discs with these signs.



■ Video systems

- This unit can play PAL and NTSC, but your television must match the system used on the disc.
- PAL discs cannot be correctly viewed on an NTSC television.
- This unit can convert NTSC signals to PAL 60 for viewing on a PAL television (➡ page 26, Video-NTSC Disc Output).
- Output is interlace (576i), when playing PAL discs.

■ Playing DVDs and Video CDs

The producer of these discs can control how they are played so you may not always be able to control play as described in these operating instructions (for example if the play time is not displayed or if a Video CD has menus). Read the disc's instructions carefully.

■ DVD-RAM discs

The DVD-RAM you can play on this unit are those recorded with DVD video recorders, DVD video cameras, personal computers, etc. using Version 1.1 of the Video Recording Format (a unified video recording standard).

- Remove discs from their cartridges before use and return them when you are finished, making sure that the labels of the disc and cartridge face the same way.
- Some parts of the disc, for example where one program ends and another begins, may not play smoothly.

■ DVD-R discs

Panasonic DVD-R recorded and finalized* on a Panasonic DVD video recorder or DVD video camera are played as DVD-Video on this unit.

■ HighMAT discs

This unit is compatible with HighMAT discs containing WMA, MP3, and/or JPEG files.

■ CD-R and CD-RW discs

This unit can play CD-R/RW (audio recording disc) recorded with CD-DA, video CD, SVCD (conforming to IEC62107), WMA, MP3, or JPEG. Finalize* the disc after recording.

See page 17 for more information about WMA, MP3, and JPEG.

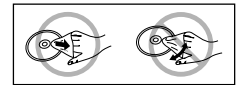
■ Disc structure

Disc structure and the labels given to the items on discs depend on the disc type.

- Title:** the largest division on DVD-Video, usually an entire movie.
- Chapter:** the smallest division on DVD-Video.
- Group:** collections of tracks on DVD-Audio and equivalent to folders or albums on data discs.
- Track:** the smallest division on DVD-Audio, CDs and Video CDs, or a single WMA/MP3 file.
- Program:** the division on DVD-RAM equivalent to a single recording.
- Scene:** DVD-RAM program sections specified and grouped into play lists on a DVD video recorder.
- Play list:** the largest grouping unit in the High MAT disk, or a bevy of DVD-RAM shots.
- Content:** including the musical pieces and images in HighMAT disk.
- Picture:** a single JPEG file.

■ To clean discs

DVD-Audio, DVD-Video, VCD,
CD: Wipe with a damp cloth
and then wipe dry.



DVD-RAM, DVD-R:

- Clean with an optional DVD-RAM/PD disc cleaner (LF-K200DCA1, where available).
- Never use cloths or cleaners for CDs etc.

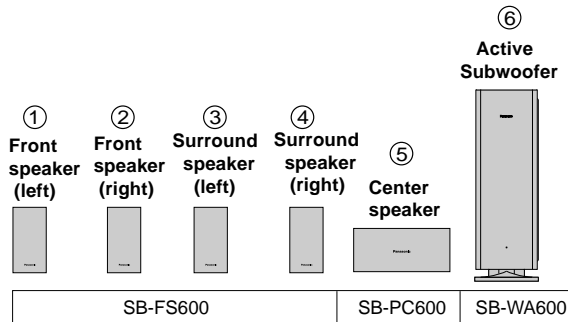
■ Handling precautions

- Do not use disc with label printed by the form printers available on the market.

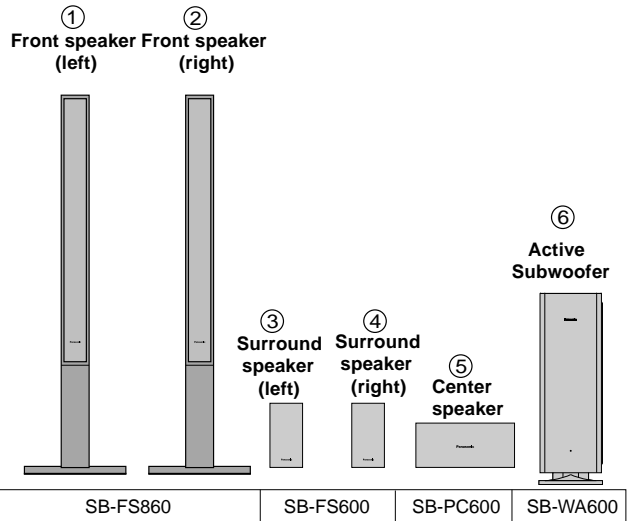

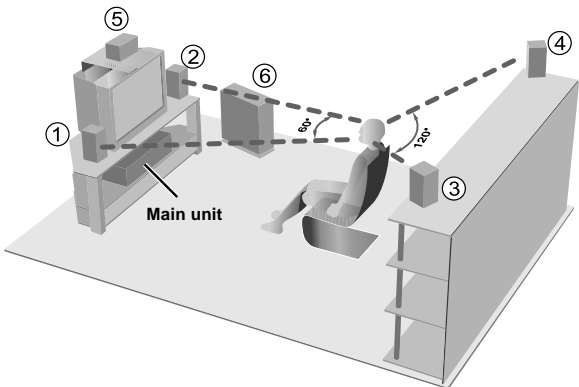

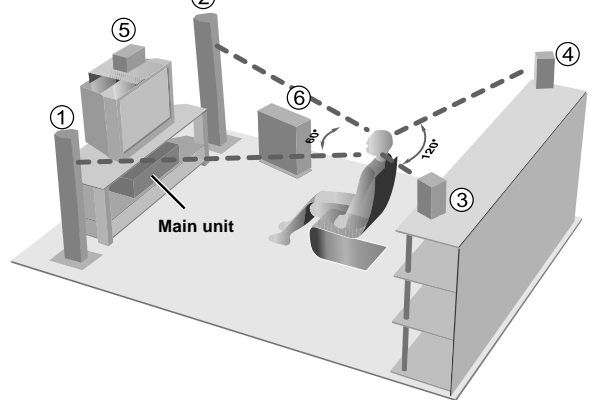

● The front speakers are the same as the surround speakers.

● Locate the front, center and surround speakers at spots with approximately equal distance from the listening area. The angles in the figure are only rough.

● Only the attached speakers can be adopted.

If other speakers are used, the unit may be damaged, and affect the sound quality.

● Locate speakers on level and reliable plane in case of falling. If you can not locate them on level planes, take suitable measures to prevent the unit falling.

Optimal location for enjoyment

The way in which the speakers are laid out will have influence upon bass and sound field; the aspects below should be regarded:

- Locate speakers on level and reliable floor.
- If the speakers are located too closely to floors, walls, or corners, extra bass will be generated, shield the walls and windows with thick curtains.

Main unit

To ensure good ventilation, the speaker and main unit must be kept at least 10 cm apart.

Center speaker

- It is acceptable to put the speaker directly under the television.
- If the middle speaker is placed directly on the television, the generated vibration may cause graphics image distortion.

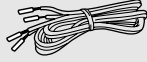
Active Subwoofer

It should be located on the ground or stable support to the left of television for fear of generating vibration.

To the right side of active subwoofer, there should be a space of 10cm in order to ensure the effective operation of the amplifier, and to the back panel of active subwoofer, there should be a space of 10cm in order to ensure ventilation.

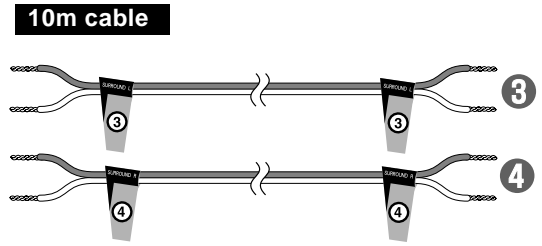
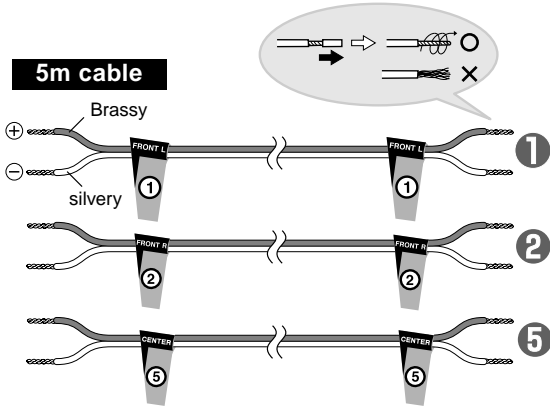


Stickers for speaker cables



1 Stick the peeled-off stickers onto speaker cables

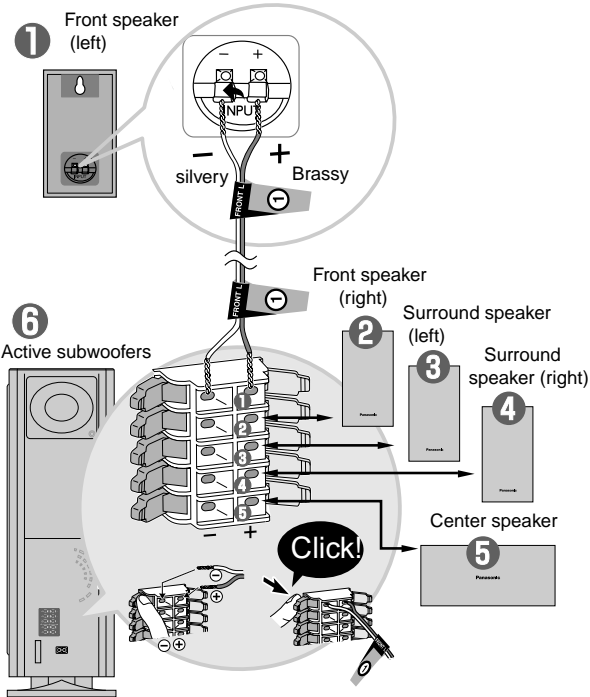
Sticking peeled-off stickers on speaker cables may facilitate connection.



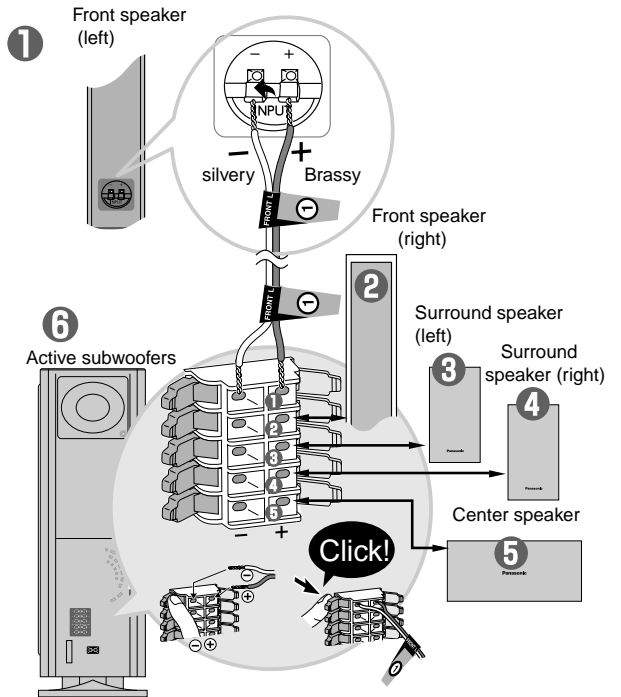
2 Connect the speakers

Keep the numbers on peeled-off stickers for speaker cables to be consistent with those on the terminals.

Note

Do not lead to short circuit in positive/ negative pole of speaker cable. Make sure to connect the positive pole (brassy color) of cable to terminal (+), the negative pole (silvery color) of speaker cable to terminal (-). Incorrect connection may damage the speaker.

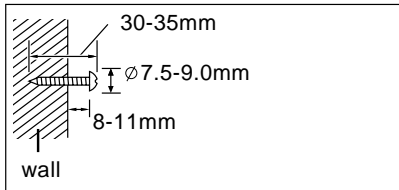
Other methods for installation of center speakers and surround speakers

Attaching to a wall

Note

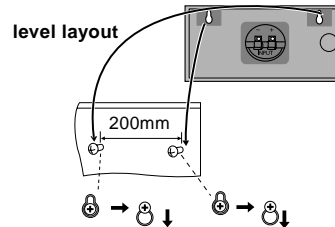
The walls or beams for hanging speakers should be capable of bearing a weight of 10kg.

1. Screw the screws (not included) into the wooden walls.



2. Fix the speakers upon the screws through the holes in the speakers

Precautions on speaker operation

- If the speakers are operated at high volume for long term, they may be damaged and their service life may be shortened.
- In following conditions, please reduce the volume in order to avoid damage.
 - When the speakers give out distorted sound.
 - When speakers receive the whistle from microphone or record player, the noises from the FM radio, or the continuous signals from oscillator, testing disc or electronic instruments.
 - When sound quality is being adjusted.
 - When you switch on or off the unit.

Warning

- The speakers can be operated only together with the recommended devices, otherwise, the amplifier or speakers may be damaged, even leading to a fire. If there is any damage or you feel that there is certain abrupt change, consult professional maintainers
- Never hang these speakers in methods other than those described in the operating instruction.

If there are abnormal colors on the television

Although these speakers are designed to be located near televisions, with some combinations of television and equipment, the image may be affected.

If this happens, switch off the television for about 30 minutes.

The demagnetizing function of television can correct the problem; if the problem remains the same, locate the speakers farther from the television.

How to install the baseplate of front speaker and how to use the rear clip

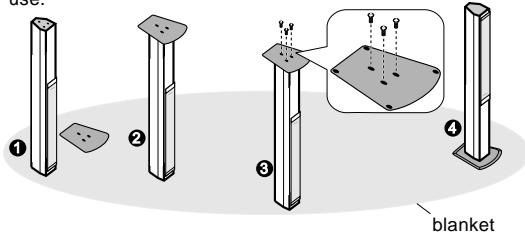

Installation method of front speaker baseplate when installing, please avoid the speaker falling over.

Screw



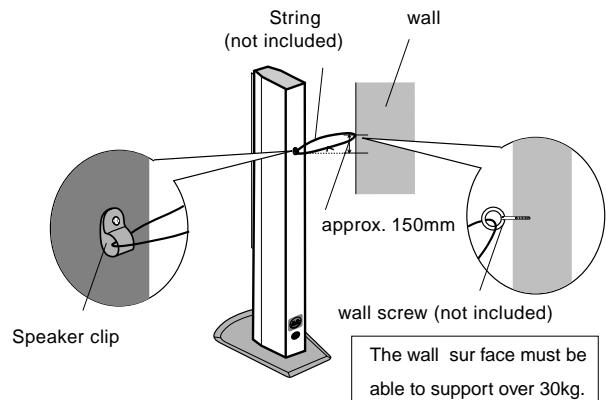
- 1 The installation is requested to perform on a blanket or a floor covered with soft cloth for fear of damaging the speakers.
- 2 Reverse the front speaker box, and place the baseplate on the speaker (with the foot pads upward), and 3 holes in the baseplate should be aligned to the 3 holes in the speaker accordingly.
- 3 The screws attached to this packing box are used to place into the 3 holes. Use a screw driver to screw up the 3 screws until the baseplate and speaker tightly joined and secure. Please use proper strength, otherwise, the hole will be damaged.
- 4 Reverse the installed speaker, so that the unit is ready for use.



How to use the clip behind speaker

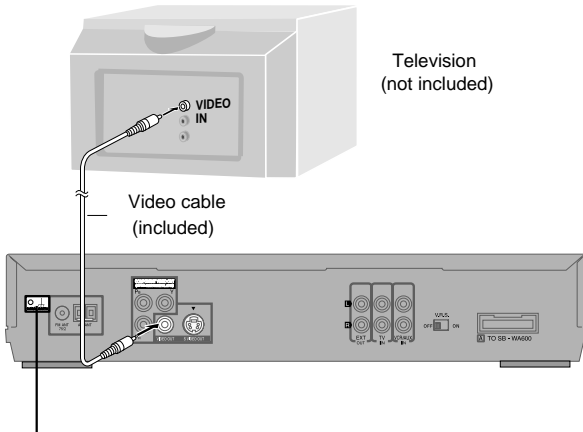
The speaker is equipped with clip at its upper rear, which may be used to prevent the speaker from falling.

User may tie the clip to a solid string, strain and fix the string onto wall behind the speaker or other solid objects.



Step 3 Connect to television

■ Connect the unit to television with VIDEO IN terminal.



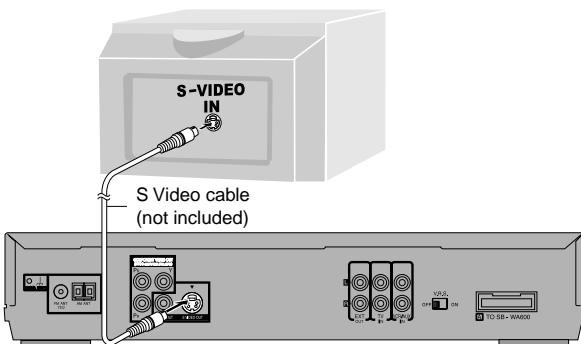
Signal grounding terminal

Connect the signal grounding terminal with the earthing wire, so as to minimize the sound distortion in the microphone in Karaoke stereo system.

Connect your unit directly to your television.

Do not connect your unit to the television through the video cassette recorder, otherwise, this will cause the protection of the copy thus resulting in abnormal play of the images.

■ Connect the unit to television with S-VIDEO IN terminals.



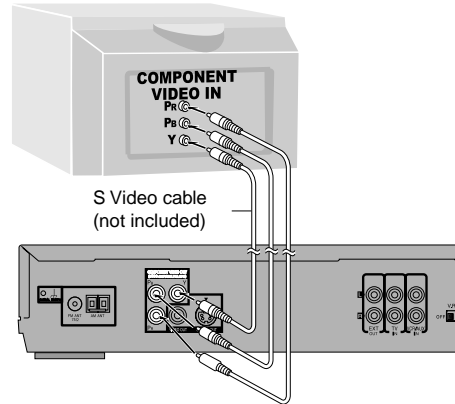
S-VIDEO OUT terminal

By separating the chrome signal (C) and brightness signal (Y), more vivid pictures can be reproduced than that reproduced by S-VIDEO OUT terminal (actual results depend on the television.)

Video cable



■ Connect the unit to television with COMPONENT VIDEO IN terminals.



COMPONENT VIDEO OUT terminal

These terminals are applicable to either interlace output or progressive scanning output, so the pictures are clearer than those output by S-VIDEO OUT terminal.

Connection by these terminals can separately output Pa/Pb signal and Y signal, so it can reproduce hi-fi colors.

■ View image by progressive scanning (NTSC disc only)

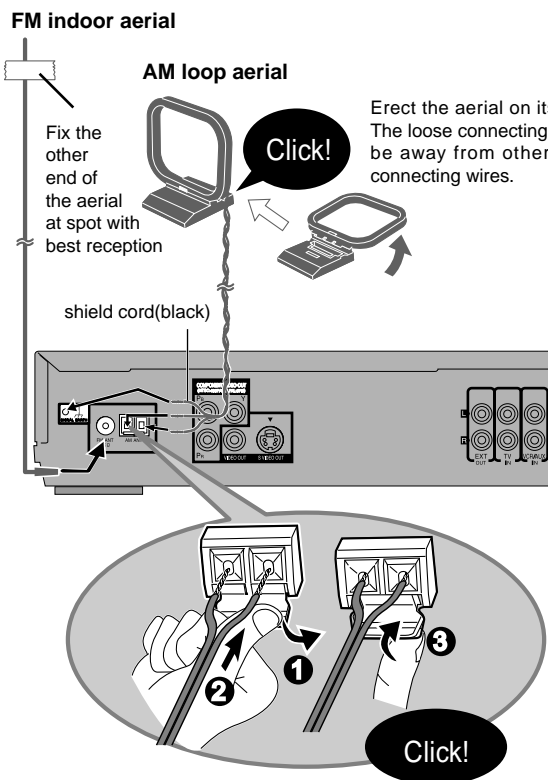
1. Connect onto a 480P compatible television with Component Video In terminals.
(If the unit is connected to an incompatible television, the images may not be correctly displayed.)
2. Press [PROGRESSIVE OUT] on the front panel of the main unit, and the display of the base unit shows: "PROG." (→ Page 12).

- All Panasonic televisions applying Line-by-Line Scanning technology and with 480P input connectors are compatible. If you own another brand of television, please consult the manufacturer.

Step 4 Connect the Active subwoofer, antenna and AC power cord



Connect the AC power supply cord after all other connections are finished.

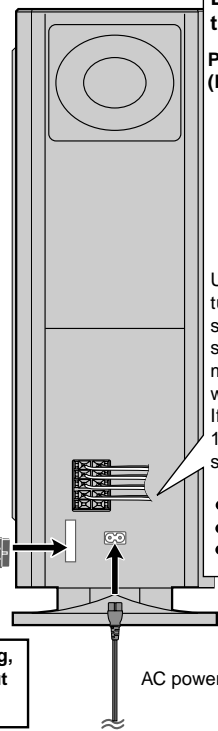


Erect the aerial on its mounting. The loose connecting wire should be away from other wires and connecting wires.

Fix the other end of the aerial at spot with best reception

When dismantling, press and pull out the staple.

To socket of domestic power supply

For Asia Before you connect the AC power supply

Prest voltage (Back of active subwoofer)

127V = 110V = 220V-230V = 240V



Use flat screwdriver to turn the voltage adjusting switch at the rear of active subwoofer to the position matching with the region where the system installed. If local voltage is 115V or 120V, please set the voltage selector switch as below:

- For 115V: Set it to 110V
- For 120V: Set it to 127V
- Factory preset: 240V

Conserving power

The unit consumes a small amount of power, even when it is turned off (about 0.9W). To save power when the unit is not to be used for a long time, unplug it from the household AC outlet. Remember that the radio programs and any other memory items should be reset before next operation of the unit.

Reference

The data memorized by the unit can be preserved intact at most 2 weeks after the AC power cord is unplugged.

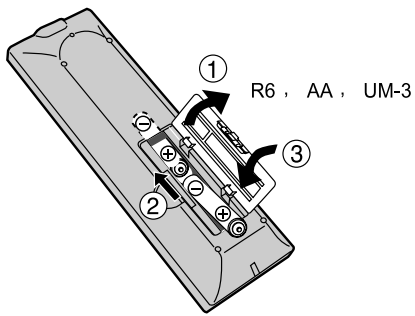
Step 5 Remote control

Batteries

Do not:

- mix old and new batteries.
 - use different types at the same time.
 - heat or expose to flame.
 - take apart or short circuit.
 - attempt to recharge alkaline or manganese batteries.
 - use batteries if the covering has been peeled off.
- Mishandling of batteries can cause electrolyte leakage which can damage items the fluid contacts and may cause a fire.

Remove if the remote control is not going to be used for a long period of time. Store in a cool, dark place.

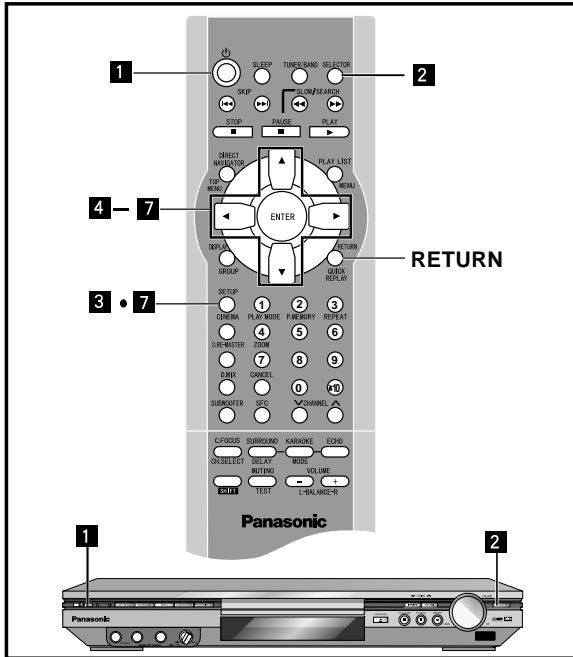


- Insert so the poles(+ and-) match those in the remote control.
- Do not use rechargeable type batteries.

Operation

Aim at the sensor, avoiding obstacles, at a maximum range of 7m directly in front of the unit.

Step 6 Quick setup



The **QUICK SETUP** screen appears when you press [SETUP] the first time after purchase and assists you to make necessary settings.

Glossary

Decoder

A decoder restores coded audio signals on DVDs to normal.

Dolby Digital

This is a method of coding digital signals developed by Dolby Laboratories. Apart from stereo (2-channel) audio, these signals can also be multi-channel audio. A large amount of audio information can be recorded on one disc using this method.

Dolby Pro Logic

A surround system where a 4-channel audio track is recorded as 2 channels and then is restored to 4 channels for play. The surround channel is monaural and can reproduce up to 7 kHz.

DTS (Digital Theater Systems)

This surround system is used in many movie theaters around the world. There is good separation between the channels, so realistic sound effects are possible.

Dynamic range

Dynamic range is the difference between the lowest level of sound that can be heard above the noise of the equipment and the highest level of sound before distortion occurs.

Frame still and field still

Frames are the still pictures that make moving pictures. About thirty are shown each second. A frame still may appear blurred but overall quality is high. Two fields appear alternately to make up one frame. A field still is not blurred but picture quality is lower. Interlace and progressive output NTSC, the video signal standard, has 480 interlaced (I) scan lines, whereas progressive scanning uses twice the number of scan lines. This is called 480P.

I/P/B

MPEG 2, the video compression standard adopted for use with DVD-Video, codes frames using these 3 picture types.

I: Intra coded picture

This picture has the best quality and is the best to use when adjusting the picture.

P: Predictive coded picture

This picture is calculated based on past I or P-pictures.

B: Bidirectionally-predictive coded picture

This picture is calculated by comparing past and future I and P-pictures so it has the lowest volume of information.

Content Play(Playback control, PBC)

If the VCD/SVCD is incorporated with content play, you can select the desired scene and information through the content.


